Another month gone by, hope you have had a safe and fruitful 2025 to date. Flying weather is right in front of us. It is time to start inspecting and performing preventative maintenance on your aircraft.

For all aircraft if they have been stored in the garage or other cold space over the winter, take a look at all the plastic control horns and clevises. The nylon and plastic can get brittle over time. The most important checks are your LiPo batteries. Hopefully you have all of your batteries discharged to a storage level over the off season. Check for puffy packs, if found puffy or a voltage lower than the recommended storage level, consider replacement. If you try to recover them by charging at a lower rate, please be careful. I urge everyone to use LiPo charge bags or other protective covering when charging! Maybe consider getting a fire blanket and keeping it close. Keep in mind that water or ABC extinguishers will not put out a LiPo fire.

If you fly nitro or gas, check your fuel tanks and fuel lines. Often times the Tygon tubing on your gas engine applications gets stiff over time. This is ok outside the tank, however, inside the tank you may lose fuel flow from the clunk not staying in the fuel. On Nitro engines the silicone fuel tubing can swell and become loose and the clunk may fall off pickup tubing.

My winter project was a CARF Rebel Pro. 102" wingspan, 113" length, 38.5 pounds dry with a Swiwin 220 turbine for power. Thanks to Warren and Harold for assistance in confirming weight and checking balance. Looking forward to getting some flying weather and to see what new aircraft everyone has to bring out.



# Armstrong Air & Space Museum in Wapakoneta

Find two full-sized aircraft flown by Armstrong himself, along with Apollo 11 artifacts and authentic space capsules! # National Museum of the U.S. Air Force in Dayton

Long a pillar of the local community, the <u>National Museum of the U.S. Air Force</u> serve s as the world's largest collection of military aviation history with more than 360 different aircraft on display. Gaze at history-making flyers like the Memphis Belle or the Apollo 15 Command Module. Great for all ages, the museum is both awe-inspiring and interactive.



## NASA Glenn Visitor Center in Cleveland

# International Women's Air & Space Museum in Cleveland

Serving as a repository for women's impact on the space and aviation industry, the <u>International Women's Air & Space Museu m</u> currently displays permanent exhibitions of beloved flyers like Amelia Earhart, The Mercury 13 and Harriet Quimby - the first American woman to get a pilot's license.



## Liberty Aviation Museum in Port Clinton

# The National Aviation Heritage Area in Dayton

Learn and find out how you can help build a replica of the <u>Wright B Flyer</u> - America's first factory-built airplane or meet the legends that shaped <u>aviation and space travel</u> at the <u>National Aviation Hall of Fame</u>. Reach new heights at the <u>National Aviation Heritage Area</u>, an entire corner of southwest Ohio that celebrates Ohio's influence and legacy in flight. It includes sites

like <u>Huffman Prairie Flying Field</u> and <u>Historic W</u> <u>ACO Field</u>.



## Warren Airways Airport

This <u>half-scale replica</u> of Apollo 11's lunar landing module, which is nearly 13 feet tall and

12 feet wide, marks the site where the first man on the moon, Neil Armstrong, took off during his first airplane ride at the age of six.

Near the entrance to the site is an Ohio <u>historical marker</u> honoring another U.S. astronaut, Ron Parise, who was born and raised in Warren and flew two missions on the space shuttle in 1990 and 1995.



## Cincinnati Museum Center Space Gallery

The Neil Armstrong Space Exploration Gallery is a new permanent exhibit that celebrates the legacy of the Apollo 11 Mission. The gallery is centered around a 360-degree immersive theater experience, and also features four unique artifacts from the Apollo 11 mission.
